What's Blooming? (The Streetscape/TOI Update)



Sprinkling The Love - This past month Oroville Streetscape provided some financial support to the City of Oroville by partially funding a new underground sprinkler system in Triangle Park. We want to thank the Oroville City crew and The Oroville Initiative members for helping us complete the landscaping of Triangle Park. We also want to thank Walt Arnold for refinishing the benches there. Walt and Streetscape members have plans for more upkeep at Welcome Gate Park in July, including refinishing the pergolas. We are also in the early stages of planning a social gathering for Streetscape members in early August so stay tuned for the date and location.

The Oroville Initiative Update - TOI has completed the improvements to Triangle Park. The new kiosk at Triangle Park will have information on the Pacific NorthWest Trail. Dry camp spots are 90% done at Whistler Canyon and we are waiting on the final signage. Kernan Street trail head is under construction. The area has been leveled and cleared of brush and the concrete for the two picnic shelters has been poured, A new kiosk at Kernan Street has been installed and PNWT is developing signage that should be installed by September. Five picnic tables have been ordered from Curlew Job Corps for placement at Whistler Canyon and Kernan St. Finally, TOI has been asked to partner with the City of Oroville to assist with developing a parks plan. This is a grant opportunity for the City to engage the community on ideas for improvements and future infrastructure for all of Oroville's parks.

What's Happening in Oroville in July?



Chesaw Rodeo - Chesaw is getting ready for the 81st Annual 4th of July Rodeo. Family games start at 10am, the parade at 12:30, and the rodeo starts at 1. The rodeo features junior events like cow riding, calf riding & scramble, barrels. Senior events include cow riding, calf roping, regular saddle bronc, ranch saddle bronc, bareback, wild cow milking, open barrel races, and women's breakaway roping. Admission is \$5 and 6 and under are free. A community dance featuring Boones Toones is planned for July 3rd from 8-12. Admission for the dance is \$5 and 6 and under free.

July 4th Fireworks - The Oroville Chamber of Commerce presents their Annual 4th of July Fireworks Show at Deep Bay Park. Starting at 5pm, there will be cheeseburgers for \$10 and hotdogs for \$5. Cost includes a bag of chips and a drink. Those attending are encouraged to park outside the park (no parking will be available at Deep Bay after 3pm). TRANGO is providing shuttle service from Prince's parking lot every 15 minutes starting at 6pm until after the fireworks show. Community support for this event is what makes the fireworks display possible. Donations are welcome and can be made at Umpqua Bank.
