Oroville residents may schedule pickups of burnables, appliances and some metals by contacting City Hall at 476-2926. Pickup date will be Wednesday, April 10th, 2024. Burnables (leaves, tree limbs, grass clippings, etc) will be accepted although they must be separated and placed into cardboard boxes, paper bags or plastic bags. Limbs should be bundled for easy pickup. Regular household garbage, tires, etc will no longer be accepted. Take advantage of this opportunity to clean up your neighborhood!
